


Parent's Rights and Responsibilities in I.J.P.S Community



Parents have Right to :

- 1) Feel welcomed, respected, and supported in their school.
- 2) Be treated with respect and courtesy by all the school personnel, without regards to race, gender, nationality , religion, ethnicity, disability or economic status.
- 3) Participate in regular written or verbal communication with teachers or other school staff and share concern regarding their child's academic, social and behavioral progress.
- 4) Meet with principal, subject leaders or teachers in accordance to established procedures.
- 5) Participate in meaningful and productive parents- teachers, conference to discuss their child's in school and have access to other school staff, as appropriate, through the school year to discuss concern.
- 6) Be informed on regular basis, both informally and through formal progress report, of their child's academic and behavioral progress in school.
- 7) To be informed about the discipline code when their child's is subject to discipline.
- 8) Submit a complaint or appeal to the school administration, by following the complaint procedures and forms.
- 9) Know and agree the school's fees before the registration process.

All Parents are Responsible for :

- 1) Sending their child to school ready to learn.
- 2) Ensuring that their child attend school regularly and arrive on time, doing their homework and submitted on time, and responsible to cover all the lessons and the materials were missed during any lateness or absence.
- 3) Being aware of their child's work, progress, and problems by reading school notice, talking to their child about school, reviewing their child's work, and progress report, and meet with the school staff.
- 4) Maintaining verbal and /or written contact with their child teachers and principal about the progress of their child's education.
- 5) Adhering to all school's policies and regulation that pertain their child education, behavior .
- 6) Responding in a timely manner to communications from their child's school.
- 7) Attending all the meetings and conferences requested by the school.
- 8) Entering the school building in a respectful manner , refraining from disruptive behavior and treating all members of the school community with courtesy and respect.
- 9) Inform the school if the about any disability , difficulties, social problems that effect or may affect their child's academic, safety or behavioral progress; before the registration.

Parents should also:

- 1) Provide a supportive home setting where education in a priority.
- 2) Reinforce the importance of acquiring the knowledge, skills, and values needed to function effectively in society.
- 3) Question their child about school work, attendance, and behavior and discuss what is the expected by school.
- 4) Teach their child to respect the property, safety, and rights of others and importance of refraining from intimidating, harassing, or discriminatory behavior.
- 5) Parents are responsible to cover all their children's school fees on time, regardless to the parent's work, or any external financial support.
